Helping others achieve concurrent capability

Concurrent Capable Review Service

The Concurrent Capable Review Service is a Provincial Addiction and Mental Health service that provides support to leaders and programs who want to access and make planned improvements towards **welcoming, recovery-oriented and concurrent capable care**.

A Clinical Consultant from the Professional Development and Concurrent Capability Team (PDCC) will facilitate a 2.0 hour onsite workshop that promotes a collective learning experience through empowered conversation within teams.

***Leadership workshop** – for program directors and managers to review system and administrative policy, procedures and practices using COMPASS-EXEC.*

***Team/Staff workshop** - for front line clinicians and support staff to review policies, programs and practices utilizing the COMPASS-EZ, a program fidelity assessment tool.*

These conversations allow teams to develop action plans to enhance concurrent capable practice using a quality improvement process. Zones will be provided with documentation that identifies areas of strength and areas of opportunity for further development to enhance concurrent capability within their program. The review is repeated in 12-18 months to highlight progress made and to set new priorities as needed.
